School Report

PEC Meeting- August, 2022

- We have picked up a new family of three students and a couple more international students (that I reported back in June). The interest is definitely there, and as soon as things return to normal we should be getting more int'l students. We have had quite a bit of interest, unfortunately for grades that are full.
- Previously known as the "safety plan," schools are now completing a "Communicable Disease Plan" which is attached this report for your review. I will review with members at our meeting, highlighting a few things that we will do to ensure the safety of all students. The plan is grey in several areas, so I'd like to clarify my position on some of these areas.
- Back to school night- the consensus from staff is that they do not feel comfortable having a back to school evening that is in person. Definitely, no dinner, perhaps a way to have curriculum meeting outdoors... Most schools that I have connected with are not hosting an in-person session. Pam and I will discuss with PEC on Tuesday at the meeting.
- Hillary Janssens will be coming to CCS on September 14th to talk to the kids and show off her Olympic bronze medal!
- School has been asked to host after-mass social September 11, 12 after masses. I will ask staff to volunteer for this.
- Grade 7 camp- as most schools are, we are going to move this to a two day event rather than an overnight event. With current numbers we don't feel comfortable having kids overnight at camp. Many parents will opt out of this, so I have asked Timberline to change our reservation to day camp.
- September 30th is National Truth and Reconciliation Day and has designated as a non-instructional day for all schools. Schools are being encouraged to have some sort of in-service for staff around Truth and Reconciliation.
- I am having my Professional Growth evaluation done by CISVA this year. I will be sending out a survey in October to gather feedback that CISVA will then be reviewing with me. It is a new format this year, one that does not include a feedback meeting between CISVA and PEC/Pastor. I will share my growth evaluation once it is completed.
- There is a new report card template that has been released this year for all CISVA schools. It is designed to be more in line with the language of the redesigned curriculum.



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- Our staff got together in June to create a meaningful Vision Statement for CCS. Here it is:

"A Christ centered community fostering growth in the whole person through truth, beauty and goodness."

- Our school growth plan statements for this year are as follows. We will be working on these goals in teams throughout the year.

Mental Health: To help staff and students gain a better understanding of the importance of good mental health, and to provide tools and strategies necessary for students to recognize the relationship between thoughts, feelings and actions of themselves and others.

Writing: To develop a scope and sequence and implement a consistent program across the grade levels.

Liturgy: Strengthen the relationship of the students with God through the liturgy, and increase our community's awareness of what is happening in the liturgy.

ADST: Secondary Goal to be added the following year as a priority goal: To create a scope and sequence that correlates grade levels with specific core competencies and content, in order to create a list of foundational ADST skills appropriate for the different grade levels.
